"The time is fulfilled and the Kingdom of God is at hand."

These were Jesus's opening words in Mark 1.15. When Jesus was born the time was fulfilled in this sense: Christian missionaries could travel to many lands in relative ease and safety as a result of Roman roads and law enforcement, and most people could speak Latin or Greek, so language was not a great barrier.

Martin Luther was also born at an opportune time for communicating the Gospel. The printing press had just been invented, so he was able to circulate his teaching in printed form, and in Latin, which all educated people in Europe could still understand. As a result he was able to kick-start the Reformation.

One generation however has seen an unparalleled increase in the ease of communication. The Internet, smart phones, electronic books, tablet computers, social media and Google's rapidly improving free translation program would all have been inconceivable when many of us were born. Even in remote parts of the world people can read the Bible and the message of salvation at the touch of a screen.

The implication of these astonishing developments is enormous. In the light of history one must ask: has the time now been fulfilled when the Kingdom of God is at hand in its final sense, the time when Christ will return as he promised to reign on the Earth?

As you will shortly read, using e-mail, printed literature, an MPG player and the electronic transfer of funds we shall soon be helping to spread the gospel in Tierra del Fuego. And you can't get much nearer the end of the Earth than that!

"This gospel of the kingdom will be preached throughout the whole world, as a testimony to all nations; and then the end will come."
(Jesus Christ, in Matthew 24.14)

Technologist receives prophetic words from Chilean pastors

In April we asked you to pray for our efforts to contact the Chilean Ministry of Education, in the hope of setting up a meeting in August with our friend and technology expert Julian Harty. In the end Julian met some ten staff from the Ministry and remains in contact with them now! He spent several days visiting two schools in Santiago run by Christians for poorer children, and three more days down in Punta Arenas visiting a boarding school mainly for orphans.

Julian had managed to pack 15 Android tablet computers donated by Google into his hand luggage! He distributed these to the schools he visited, and gave the teachers a lot of advice and assistance in using them to obtain educational material via the Internet, either free of charge or at very low cost.

In Punta Arenas Julian was interviewed on local radio and had a write-up in the local newspaper, in which he was erroneously described as the inventor of the Raspberry Pi! This is a credit-card sized computer, which he was also able to demonstrate and donate. It contained 3000 educational videos and the entire Wikipedia encyclopaedia in Spanish.

He met the regional director of education and the deputy mayor as well as school staff. Several pastors prayed for him and brought encouraging words of prophecy for his unusual technological ministry! His interpreter was Ignacio Gomez, a famous Chilean tenor! Our friend Pastor Ronny Pulgar and his wife Betty provided hospitality.

One problem Julian discovered was that the school he visited already had 40 computers, but for various reasons not one was being used. He encouraged the school to get them into service and make full use of them.

The Lord Jesus joins the Jardín del Sol building team

In May it was estimated that a further £22,300 would be needed to complete the new Filadelfia Church building in the Jardín del Sol district of Osorno. Nevertheless in June the Mayor of Osorno, who had approved the donation of public land for the project, together with the Director of Works and other public officials, inspected the construction site and they were all pleasantly surprised at the progress that had been made.

Since May the Trust has been able to donate a further £4634 as a result of several generous donations received for that purpose.

On September 3rd the first service was held, in the smaller of the two halls. Three men and seven women attended it. By September 21st 36 people were attending Sunday worship. *"It was a glorious service,"* wrote Miguel. *"The Lord poured out his Holy Spirit, and there were brothers speaking in other languages. Glory to God!"*

More was to come. Sunday October 12th saw the first meeting in the still unfinished main hall. 200 people from 20 different churches attended a Gift Service at which they contributed £700 to help to complete the building! Jesus promised, *“I will build my church...”* and he has clearly joined the team, confirming the Filadelfia Church’s vision for a Christian community in “The Garden of the Sun”.

Developments in pastoral support

Ever since Esmenar Pérez and his family moved to Osorno in 2010 the Trust has been helping to support him financially. In September Pastor Miguel formally handed over to Esmenar’s care the original Filadelfia Church congregation in the Francke district of Osorno. This means that with income from his congregation, together with fees from part-time teaching, Esmenar no longer needs our assistance. In a long farewell message to us he wrote, *“I thank God for the blessings received, and for your sincere love and unconditional friendship. Upon completion of the final goal in terms of financial support, I thank my Lord for having put you in our path.”*

Pastor Miguel Pérez, on the other hand, is now almost totally reliant for his family’s income on the tithes and offerings of his still fledgling congregation in Jardín del Sol, the personal tithes of two assistant pastors, and a small pension. With a current income of around £650 a month and a cost of living not very different from that in Britain life will be very difficult for him. For in addition to household expenditure he has to find about £75 a month for medication in connection

with two health issues, and pay for all his personal expenses in connection with the work of the church. You may remember that earlier in the year he sold his car to help pay for the construction work.

The Trust gave Miguel £200 for his current medical expenses, which he had been unable to afford, and we have agreed to double to £400 our quarterly grant to him for the next three years. Our prayer is that by then his new congregation will be able to support him and his wife Ana fully, as is right in the Lord.

Next year Pastor Ronny Pulgar’s younger daughter Constanza is hoping to start higher education. We have been helping her elder sister Elizabeth through university with a quarterly grant of £200, so now we hope to have enough to support both of them during Elizabeth’s final year. Without our help it may not be possible for Constanza to fulfill her dream of becoming a nurse.

Since July Constanza has been visiting her grandmother’s native land of Wales under the wing of the Welsh-speaking Methodist Church. We hope to visit her shortly.

A fire is kindled in the Land of Fire

Magellan named Tierra del Fuego the Land of Fire on seeing numerous small fires kindled by the natives for warmth. Now in answer to several years of prayer it looks as though the fire of God’s Spirit is being rekindled there. Since April Pastor Ronny Pulgar has made five trips across the Straits of Magellan to hunt out fellow Methodists and other Christians living on the Island, with the intention of starting a church there.

So far Ronny has contacted five Christian families comprising eighteen persons. From 17 to 19 October he took a small team from the mainland to visit homes, hold open-air services and provide a Sunday School for children and young people. He led worship in three homes with Holy Communion.

Ronny intends to continue visiting the main town Porvenir every fortnight, usually with a fellow pastor. His goal is to appoint a suitable inhabitant to take charge of the work, and then to rent or preferably buy an existing property to use as a chapel, or else purchase land to build one on. He has identified for this purpose a neighbourhood where there is no church building at present. His next visit is scheduled for 14 and 15 November.

The return fare by boat to Porvenir is £16.25 per person, and to rent a house for worship would cost £325 a month, so money is needed for this work to continue. Members of the two Methodist Churches on the mainland have been given collecting tins, and several friends and acquaintances have become “Friends of Porvenir Mission”, promising monthly contributions which currently total £108 a month.

“The Lord has prepared the ground, we need to sow the seed, then will come the harvest,” Ronny writes. *“I plead for fervent prayer that the banner of the gospel may spread out in the city and that many may be redeemed through the blood of Christ.”*

Chile for Christ has been given a total of £2635 for mission work on the Island. We could spend some of this money on literature such as the Spanish version of Nicky Gumbel’s book, “Why Jesus?”, or help with travel costs, or invest it in readiness for the purchase of a property. We need to know the mind of the Lord in this!

Winter food parcels

July brings deep snow, freezing winds and little to eat for the Pehuenche communities living high in the Andes Mountains. This year the Trust contributed £170 to buy 10 food parcels for delivery by members of the Chilean Anglican Church.





In June we were also able to send the Christians there a second “Saber” MP3 player with recordings of the Gospel stories and evangelistic teaching and songs in the Mapudungun language.

The Chilean Anglican Church's Mission and Social Development Agency has helped to transform the lives of the Pehuenche communities in the last 20 years. Its secretary asked us earlier this year if we would be willing to pay the salary of a full-time fundraiser for his first six months in office. After seeking advice and praying we agreed to pay Hector Enriquez's salary for six months, £2250 in total, which we have done. We hope to have news of his progress next time.

Ministry to pastors and church leaders

Gerd and Rosi Bergmann are a German missionary couple who have been serving God in Chile for several years, teaching Christians to understand better the grace of God and ministering to Chilean pastors and church leaders. Chile for Christ has recently been promised £600 a year to pay the expenses of Chilean pastors in need of rest, inspiration, teaching or counselling. We have asked Gerd to use this money for bursaries to enable pastors to benefit from his ministry in the seaside town of Pichilemu.

A voice in the wilderness

Federico Bascuñán took over the leadership of the 50-member Anglican Church of St Andrew's in Arica about two years ago, after CMS missionaries David and Jean Hucker returned to England.

Arica is Chile's most northerly town, situated on the edge of the Atacama Desert. Federico tells us that the area is dry spiritually, too.

"The people here have very hard hearts. There is a strong element of Peruvian and Bolivian culture, involving ancestral and Earth worship. Cohabitation is common even among Christians. But there is nothing and no-one who can resist the Lord, because every knee will bow and every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord."

We have offered to pay for the purchase of copies of "Why Jesus?" in Spanish, and further copies of children's Bibles if these can be used in evangelistic outreach to neighbours. Meanwhile Federico asks us to pray for his work among married and unmarried couples, for wisdom, and for the money needed to repair the church roof.

Female prisoners, mental health and religious faith

Anne Aboaja is a self-funded PhD student who is studying the relationship of faith, particularly the Christian faith, with the mental health of female prisoners in Chile and Bolivia. In July she obtained permission to conduct around 75 interviews with inmates of Santiago's Women's Prison. Her aim is to produce guidance to chaplains and prison staff that will help such women to avoid depression and mental illness through faith in Christ.


The trustees felt it was worthwhile to support her work with a grant of £1000 for each of her two years of research.
