

DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

Chile for Christ Trust

1. Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR").

2. Who are we?

The trustees of Chile for Christ Trust (we/us) is the data controller (contact details below). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

3. What data do we collect and what do we use it for?

We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- Name and contact details of supporters to enable us to fundraise, send prayer requests and promote the interests of the charity;
- Name, address and taxpayer status to enable us to reclaim Gift Aid on donations;
- Name, contact details and bank details of individuals we support in Chile to enable us to distribute the donations to them;
- Name and contact details of volunteers and trustees to enable us to manage the charity effectively;
- Pseudonymous or anonymous data through cookies on our website and in emails to enable those services to operate;

4. What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

- Explicit consent of the data subject so that we can keep you informed about news, campaigns and prayer needs;
- Processing is necessary for carrying out legal obligations in relation to Gift Aid;
- Processing is necessary for the legitimate interest of the charity for administrative and organisational purposes;

5. Our obligations

We comply with our obligations under the "GDPR" by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

6. Sharing your personal data

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and we will only share your data with third parties with your consent, or as required by law for example with HMRC for Gift Aid processing.

7. How long do we keep your personal data?

We retain data relating to Gift Aid for a minimum of 6 years after the end of the tax period in which the last payment was made, as required by HMRC.

We retain your contact details until you tell us you no longer wish to be contacted by us.

8. Your rights and your personal data

Unless subject to an exemption under the GDPR, you have the following rights with respect to your personal data:

- The right **to be informed** about what data we are collecting on you and how we will use it
- The right of **access** - you can ask to see the data we hold on you
- The right to **rectification** - you can ask that we update or correct your data
- The right to **object** - you can ask that we stop using your data for a particular purpose
- The right to **erasure** - you can ask us to delete the data we hold on you
- The right to **restrict processing** - you can ask that we temporarily stop using your data while the reason for its use or its accuracy are investigated
- Though unlikely to apply to the data we hold and process on you, you also have rights related to **portability and automated decision making** (including profiling)
- The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office.

9. Further processing

If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Privacy Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
